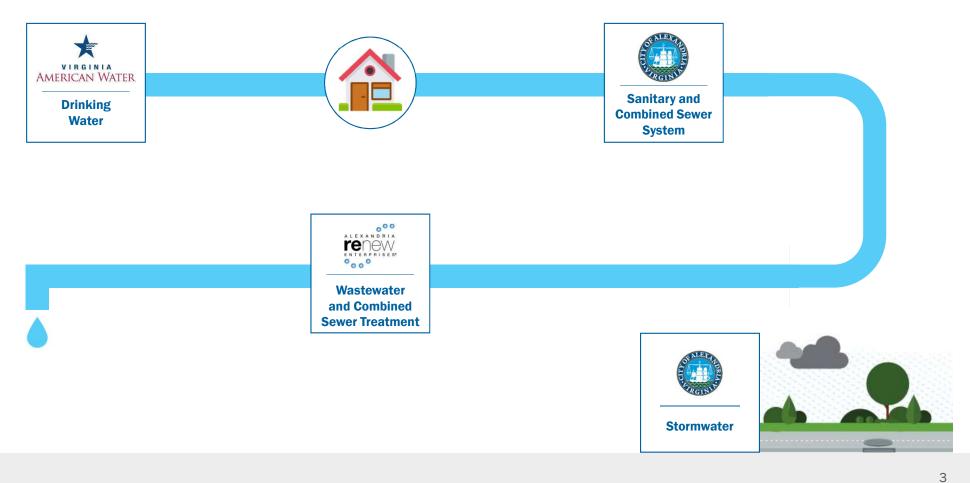

# **How Water Works in the City of Alexandria**



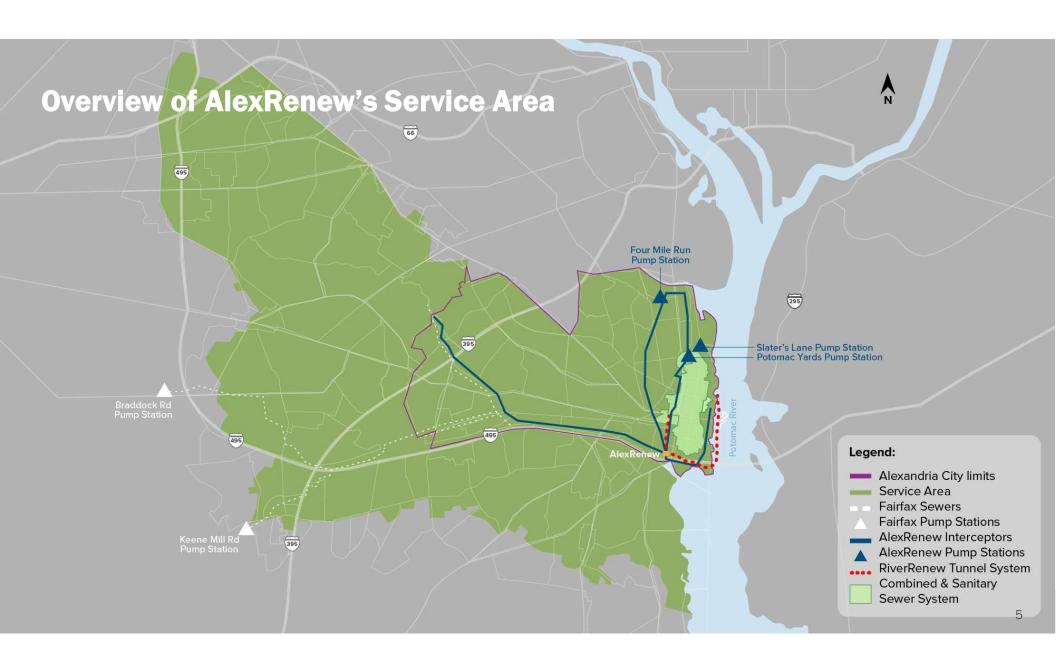


## **AlexRenew is Alexandria's Wastewater Authority**

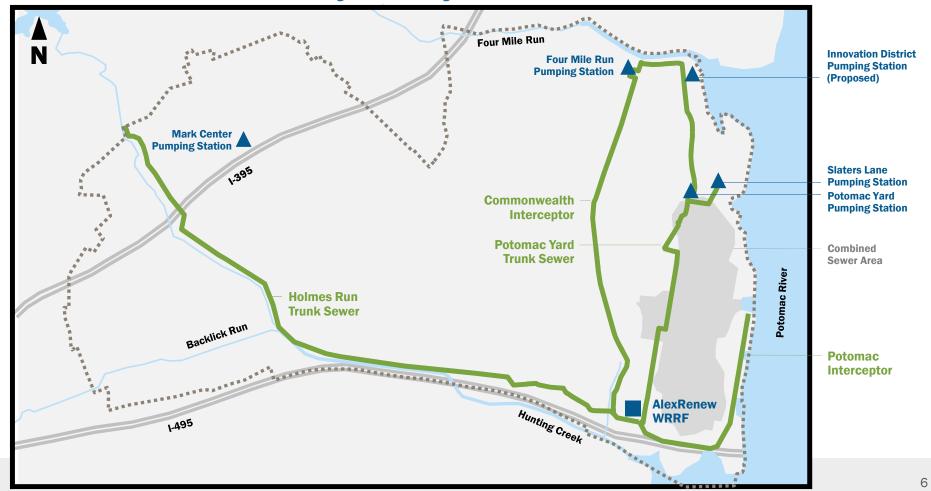
- Political subdivision of the Commonwealth
- Created and governed by Virginia Water and Waste Authorities Act
- Chartered in 1952 by Alexandria City Council
- Led by a 5-member citizen board
- Treats an average of 38 MGD of wastewater to near drinking water standards at Water Resources Recovery Facility (WRRF)
- Serves more than 300,000 customers in Alexandria and Fairfax County







# Nearly \$1 billion In System Assets Including Interceptors, Pump Stations and Water Resource Recovery Facility



## **AlexRenew Has Three Service Agreements That Impact Its Budget**

- City of Alexandria customers pay AlexRenew via wastewater rates
- Fairfax County pays AlexRenew for wholesale wastewater treatment services
- AlexRenew pays Arlington County to provide wastewater service small portion of the City where wastewater flows to Arlington's plant

Fairfax County	1973	1998	32.4 MGD
City of Alexandria	1954	2018	21.6 MGD
Arlington County	1977	1994	3.0 MGD

- Operating expenses are shared between AlexRenew and Fairfax county proportionate to actual flows to the plant
- Capital costs are shared based on service agreement and project-specific MOUs





- 2017 General Assembly Bill SB 828 (Stuart)
- Required City of Alexandria to plan, design, and construct a solution to bring four existing combined sewer outfalls into Federal and State compliance
- Construction must be complete by July 1, 2025
- On July 2, 2018, the City of Alexandria transferred the four existing outfalls and RiverRenew ownership to AlexRenew

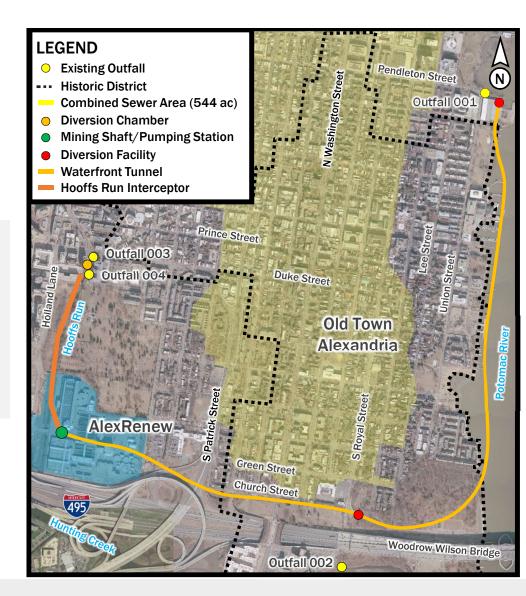

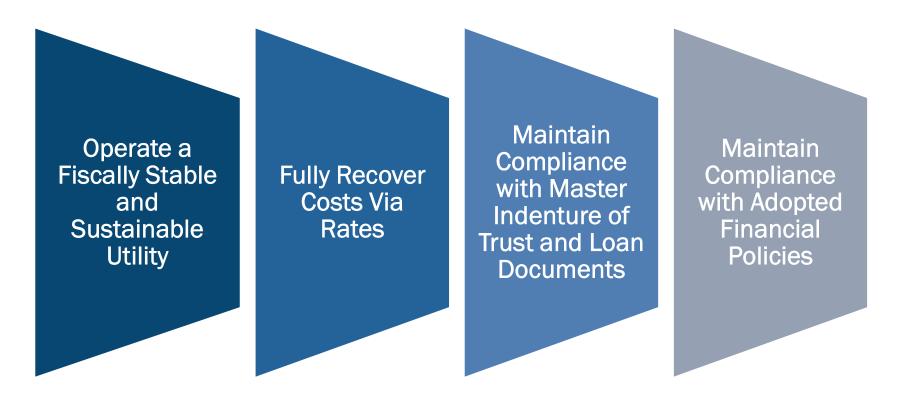

#### **AlexRenew's Financial Policies**



- Based on Master Trust Indenture and Financial Advisor Advice
- Currently Minimum Target Set at 1.5x
  - 120 Days of Operating Expenses
- Fund at least 15% of Total Capital Program (from Cash Flow and Reserves)



## **Major FY 2022 Budget Drivers**







Estimated **increases** in chemical and biosolids costs of ~1%



Significant increase in use of **debt proceeds** to **fund capital work** 



**Energy costs** anticipated to be **neutral** 



Significant increase in **capital spend** for some General Capital Projects but primarily **RiverRenew Tunnel Project** 



Employee benefit costs steady



Employee pay and hiring freezes lifted

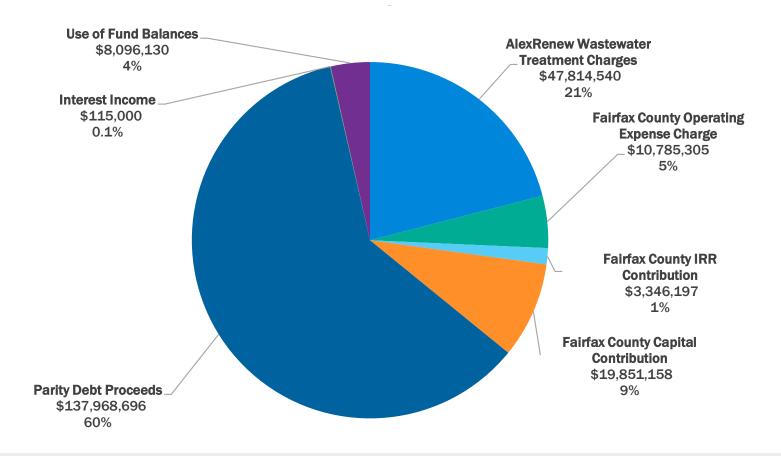

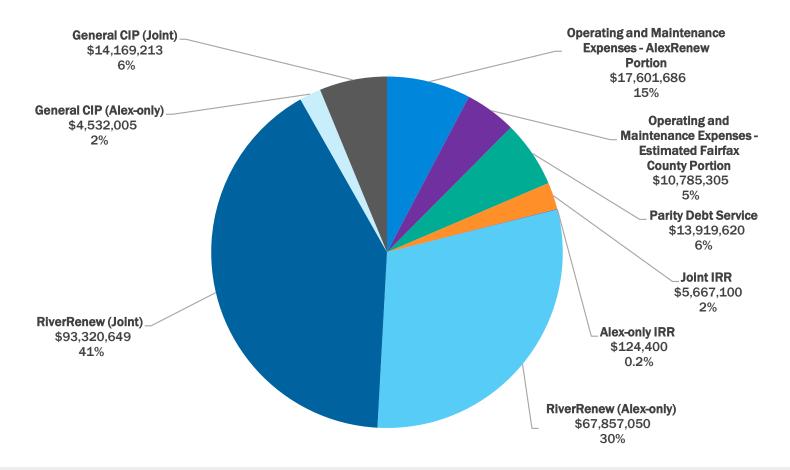


# **Overview of Proposed FY 2022 Revenue**

# **FY 2022 Budget Highlights**



#### **Debt**

- Interest rates on new debt locked in
- 1.88% on \$321M WIFIA
- 1.35% on \$185M CWRLF



#### Staffing

- Benefits costs constant
- Lift pay freeze
- Lift hiring freeze
- Merit increases included for eligible employees



#### **Capitals and Renewals**

- Total 10-year spend of \$721 million
- First year of peak in tunnel spending
- \$185 million requested for FY 2022

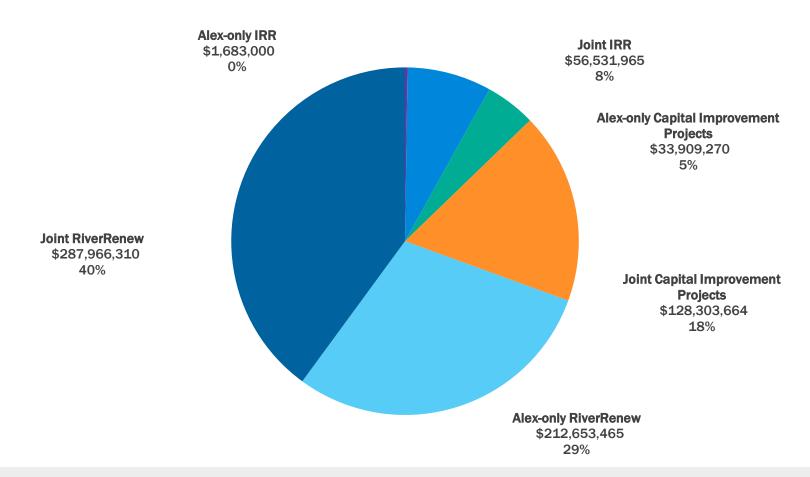


#### **Operations**

- Commodity cost increases
  - Chemicals
  - Biosolids
- Investments in technology and customer outreach
- Resources needed to continue to adapt to COVID

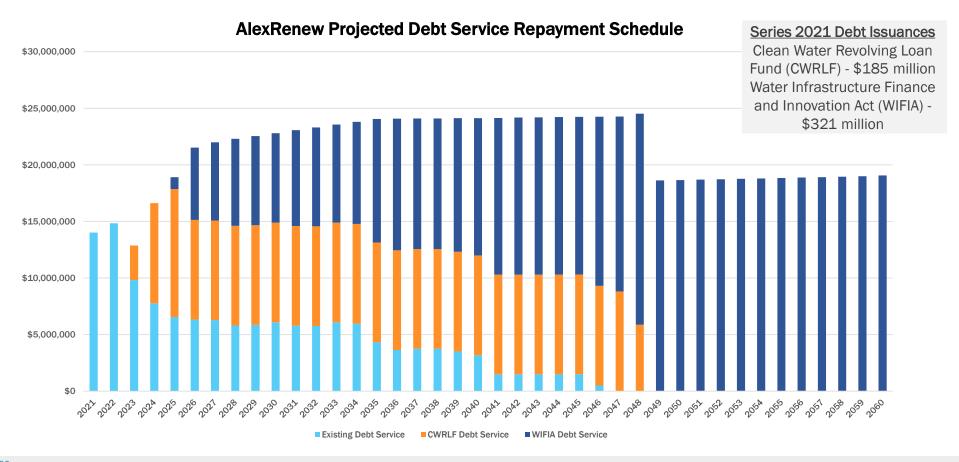

# AlexRenew is Proposing a Rate Adjustment for the Next Two Fiscal Years

<b>Proposed Two-</b>
Year Rate
Adjustment

Fiscal Year	Beginning on:	Maximum Rate Adjustment
2022	July 1, 2021	6.9%
2023	July 1, 2022	6.5%

#### **Benefits of a Two-Year Rate Adjustment:**



Maximizes efficiency of staff and consultant time



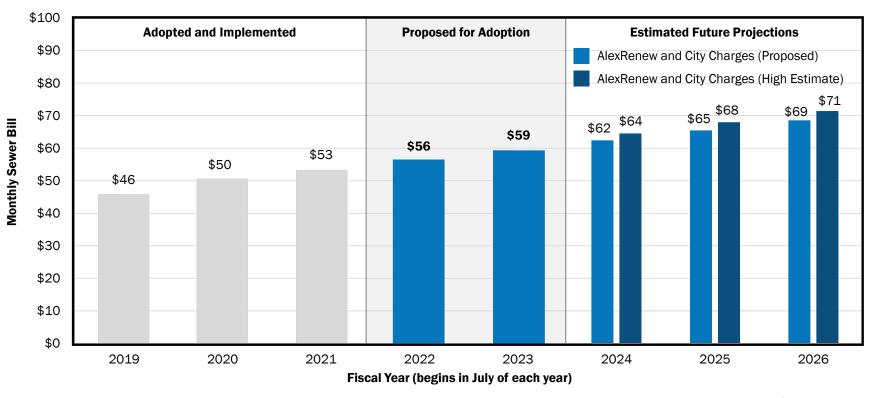
Allows for adjustment of rates as conditions evolve



Provides certainty for CIP funding, particularly in FY 2022-23 when Tunnel Project spending peaks



# Proposed Adjustments in Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 and Future Estimated Rate Projections through RiverRenew Program

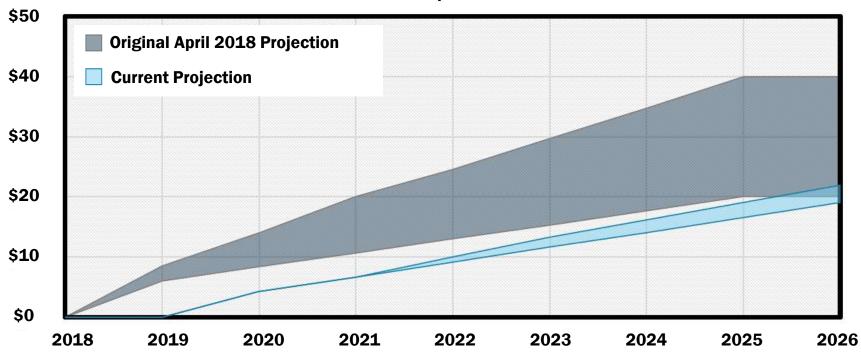

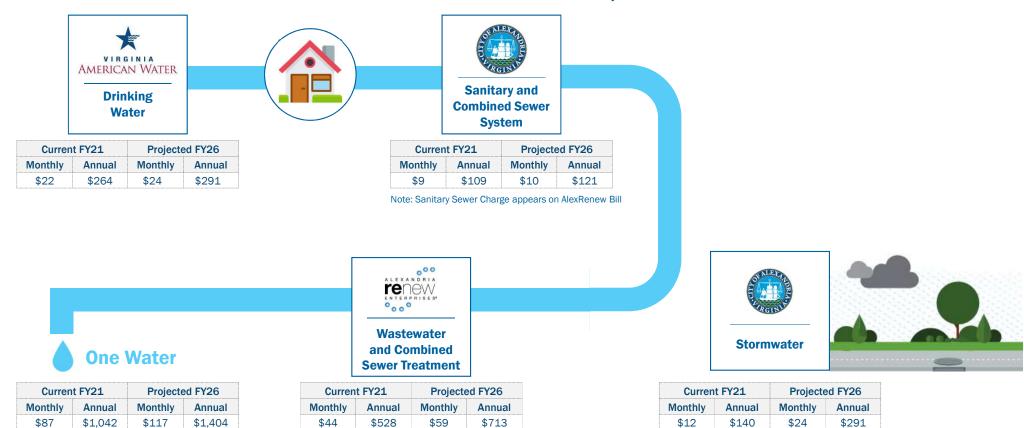

# **Estimated Cost of One Water in Alexandria, VA**

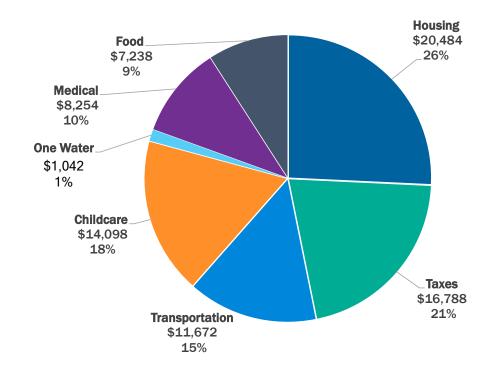

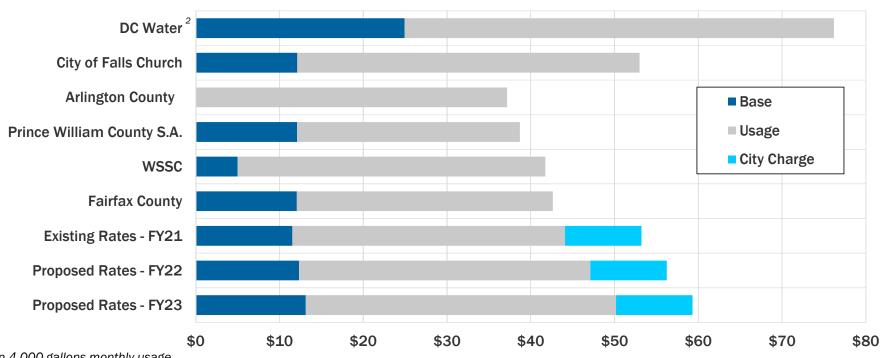

Monthly Sewer Charges For Single Family Residential Customers <sup>1</sup>



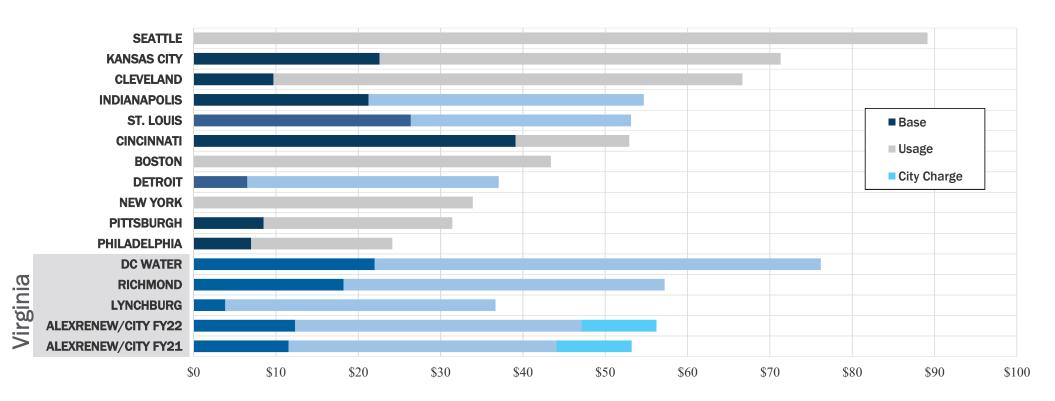

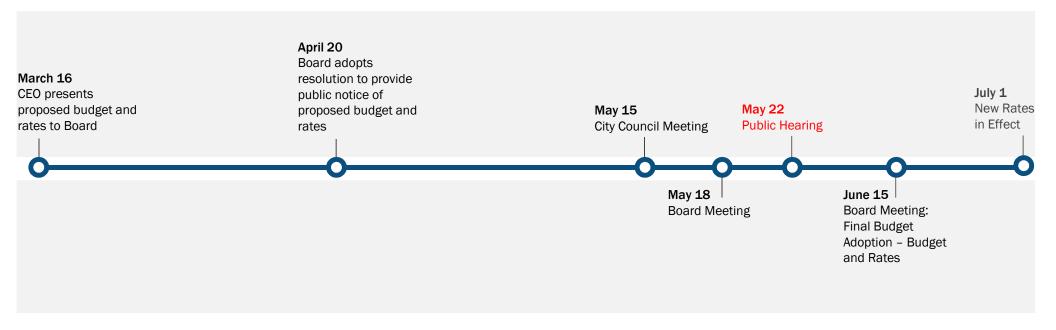
Monthly Sewer Charges For Single Family Residential Customers <sup>1</sup>
